They help with getting people back on their feet by helping with housing, jobs and counseling if needed. They have a Food Pantry and Thrift Shop located at 1203 College Street.

The **Salvation Army**, 620 Wilkinson Street, also has several services available to the community. They serve lunch daily and donate food from their pantry by appointment. Their motto is 1Peter 4:8, Above all Love. Love beyond loss, hunger, eviction, loneliness, disaster, overdue bills, addiction, and love beyond measure for all people.

The Emmaus Center accepts food and clothing donations at the thrift shop on Tuesday through Thursday from 10 am to 2 pm. The Salvation Army also accepts food donations at all times.
